## Program Details

Our Summer English Language Camp is designed for children & teens who want to live in Toronto, improve their English, make friends from around the world, and visit exciting tourist destinations. Students will experience unforgettable memories to last a lifetime!

Students will attend daily morning English classes, and have the choice of going on daily afternoon trips around the city of Toronto, or attending afternoon tennis clinics. . Led by our teachers, the trips are a fun way to see the city with your classmates. Meet students from other countries around the world, and practice your English at the same ! Beyond daily English classes and activities, our package includes a full-day trip every Saturday to destinations such as: Niagara Falls, Canada's Wonderland, and Wasaga Beach.

### FULL PACKAGE includes:

- » 3 hours of daily English instruction (Monday to Friday)
  - » Homestay accommodation (private room, 3 meals/day, packed lunch)
  - » Daily afternoon trips & activities, including all entrance fees (Monday to Friday) - substitute trips for tennis lessons (see +TENNIS below)
  - » a full day trip every Saturday (Niagara Falls, Canada's Wonderland, Wasaga Beach)
  - » Airport pick-up & drop-off
  - » Medical Insurance
  - » All materials, Certificate of Completion, Graduation Ceremony
  - » All registration and placement fees
  - » Notarized Canadian Guardian documentation

### PARTIAL PACKAGE includes:

The Partial Package includes all features of the Full Package, except for Homestay, airport pick-up & drop-off.

### +TENNIS (optional add-on)

Students can choose the FULL PACKAGE or PARTIAL PACKAGE, and then substitute weekday afternoon trips with daily afternoon tennis lessons. Taught by experienced tennis instructors, this option is the perfect choice for those who want to improve their English and tennis skills at the same time! Students choosing this option will still have full-day Saturday trips included.

## Dates

The entire program runs for 9 weeks, starting June 28th and ending on August 27th. Students can choose to stay for periods of one to nine weeks. For specific dates, please consult the Summer Camp Application Form.

## Location

Summer camp classes are held in downtown Toronto at St. Vladimir Institute (a 10-minute walk from our main location). The school is located at 620 Spadina Avenue surrounded by the University of Toronto buildings. Our facility has air-conditioned classrooms, a student area with a ping-pong table, vending machines for juice and pop, and refrigerators to keep lunches cold. The school is a five-minute walk from Spadina subway station. Host families will show students how to get to school the first day.



### Students

Our students come from a number of countries around the world including: Russia, Korea, Spain, Japan, Venezuela, Brazil, Saudi Arabia, Switzerland, and more. All students are expected to speak in English at all times.

### Accommodation

Most of our students stay in **Homestay** accommodation with Canadian families. Students have the option of a private room or a shared room with a student from another country. Both options are the same price. Homestay hosts provide three meals per day which include a packed lunch to take to school. Homes are located within 45 minutes by public transportation to the school. All host families have been carefully screened by our Homestay Coordinator to ensure our students' comfort and safety. Students under the age of 10 will be placed in a homestay with an older student who will accompany them to school, or will be driven to school daily by their host family (*additional fee applies*).

We can arrange residence accommodation (for groups only) at various private residences which are close to the school. Breakfast and dinner are served at the residence and the residence will give each student a packed lunch to take to school. There is an extra charge for residence accommodation. Please ask ACCESS for costs if you are interested in this option.

### Activities

Students will visit Canada's Wonderland, Niagara Falls and Wasaga Beach on Saturdays.

Every day the students will have an activity during the afternoon. On all activities students are expected to speak English only. Please refer to the activity schedule for a description of each activity.

### Transportation

All students must be mature enough to use public transportation on their own. Students are responsible for the transportation costs of travelling to and from school and the cost of travelling on the transit system to various activities. The average monthly cost of TTC transportation is approximately \$110.00 CDN. The average cost of TTC tickets is 10 for \$20.00 CDN. Students will need one ticket each way to and from school as well as to and from the daily activity. Please allow at least \$125.00 CDN if you are coming mid-month for TTC tickets. Our bus and subway system are clean, safe and very easy to use. The traveling time averages about 35-45 minutes from the home to the school.

### English Classes

Our classes combine the areas of study (grammar, writing, reading, speaking and listening) with interesting activities to expose our students to Canadian culture. On the first day of class, students will be given a written test and a verbal test. They will then be placed in an appropriate class level with a mix of students from other countries. Students are expected to participate in all classes. Any absences will be noted on the student's report card at the end of the session. We expect all students to respect fellow students and their teachers at all times.

### Teachers & Activity Staff

All teachers are TESL certified and have experience teaching students from many cultural backgrounds. On all school activities teachers accompany students to the various activities.
